

**U.S. Judge Orders
Garrison to Stop
Prosecuting Staff**

NEW YORK, N.Y. (AP) — A federal judge today ordered a prominent abolitionist to stop prosecuting his own staff members in a case involving a woman who had filed a lawsuit against him. The judge's order, issued in the Southern District of New York, came after a hearing on the woman's motion for summary judgment. The woman, who is the wife of a prominent abolitionist, had filed a lawsuit against her husband, claiming that he had sexually abused her.
