In issuing the order, Judge Christenberry noted that the Fifth U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals yesterday instructed him to hear the matter and said after considering the pleas of Shaw's attorneys, "It appears to the court that immediate and treeparable injury, loss and damage will result to the plaintiff if a temporary restraining order is not issued."
