Garrison, 9 Others Due at Shaw Hearing

, Clay L. Shaw's attorneys have subpoeneed Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison and nine others to appear at a federal court h earing here Monday on Shaw's move to block his prosecution on a perjury charge in state court.

Garrison accused Shaw of lying to the jury which, in 1969, found him innocent of charges of conspiring to assassinate President John F. Kennedy.

The perjury trial was to have started earlier this week but Shaw's 'lawyers obtained a federal court temporary restraining order blocking the trial until the plea for 'an injunction is heard and decided.

OTHERSSUBPOENAED yesterday include Andrew (Mumu) Schiambra and John Volz, Garrison's assistants, and Criminal District Judge James L. Alcock, who was Garrison's chief aide during the conspiracy prosecution of Shaw.

Also subpoenaed were Perry Raymond Russo, Garrison's star witness in the conspiracy trial; New Orleans police LL. Ed O'Donnell, Criminal District Court Judge Malcolm V. O'Hara, who is scheduled to hear the perjury case in state court, and three members of a business group that provided funds for Garrison's assastmation probe, Willard Robterson, Joseph Rault and Cecil

Shilstone. SHAW CONTENDS that Garrison's perjury prosecution is only for harassment and is in violation of Shaw's constitutional rights.

Garrison charged Shaw with perjury two days after the conspiracy trial ended. He claimed Shaw hed when he denied knowing Lee Harvey Oswald and David Ferrie, named as co-conspirators in the plot.

The Warren Commission named Oswald as the lone assassin. Both Oswald and Ferrie are now dead.
