I have heard nothing further on your 11/17/68 letter to Ivon. If I know how it worked, and I think I do, he turned it over to Moc who has not since found time to do snything. I have looked the list over, compared it with what I have carded, and have most of what you did not send.

If 1518, fingerprints, Wasp handbill, is the same as what I recently sent you from 1485, I have it. Otherwise I do not. Is 75:376-7 same as 1485? If not, I do not have that. In that list I also have 30:6-9; 75-222,232,684-5; 87:449.

On one of the other lists, strengely, thinking I had every shred on Bringuier, I seem not to have 75:703-4. I think it is mislaid, but I cannot now find it. This, I think, will give me a complete file. I presume Tom has a complete file of your memos.

Moo told me tonight that Oser is handling the Desley Plaza part and Wecht and Nichols. He will select his own witnesses, handle it his own way. I hope he assimilates fast. I know he has been to Dallas, interviewed quite a few witnesses, etc.

I again urged them, if they really go into the autopsy, to subpens the notes. They do exist. They were not burned.  $^{\rm I}$  do have the receipts, and some do specify. I hate to take the edge off my own book, but I regard this as important.

Things should get more intense from now on in, unless the change of venue is granted. That might delay things. There will undoubtedly be more interruptions in the office than the two-many there have been (and cennot be svoided).

I've a couple more memos to do, then I'll have to concentrate on packing things up. I expect to get some containers in Washington 1/9. I sure hope the 3M paper comes by then. I also asked Johnson to go over my requests and have everything missing by then. He said yes and that means 0. Were I to take the time and make a list, it would be a long one.
