One of the things I've intended doing in New Orleans and never gotten around to is interviewing Preston Davis and Eva Springer, if they are still around. Both, really, confirmed Andrews' story, especially Davis. Neither was questioned for information by the FBI. Both, undoubtedly, have some. If your office has ever interviewed either, I am unaware of it.

There should be time when I am there for this, if you agree; please ask Louis to have them located to save time. That is, their home addresses and phones, possibly their places of employment.

I think it probable the defense has already questioned both, may have statements from them.

Nonetheless, more, especially if this is true, I think they should be spoken to.

If you have spoken to them, I'd appreciate copies of the statements so I can read them in advance, compare them with what I have.

With Davis, and with his knowing that Andrews spoke the truth about Oswald having been in the office, if he is the usual run of investigator, is it not reasonable to assume this might have excited his interest and he might have developed information on his own afterward? I am willing to assume he knew more than the FBI report (GD75:195) shows.
