GARRISON charges Shaw lied Bethell, the former Garrison in-under oath in testifying on his vestigator charged yesterday own behalf when he denied with unlawful use of movable knowing David W. Ferrie, an airplane pilot now dead, and Lee Harvey Oswald.

The perjury charges carry a penalty of one to 10 years imprisonment and \$1,000 fine for each count. Shaw was released on his own recognizance Mondav.

Judge O'Hara said the defense can ask a preliminary hearing, but is not automatically en-titled to one. "It would be up to my discretion," he said.

IN VIEW OF the widespread national publicity given Shaw's first trial, the judge said he will consider setting guidelines for the press. "But I just got this case . . . and I haven't formulated any policies yet," he said. "A lot can happen before this

thing comes to triai."

Assistant District Attorney William Alford Jr., yesterday leveled charges in a bill of information against Bethell.

BETHELL, A former London school teacher, was charged with unlawful use of movable property for allegedly showing the state's trial memorandum

in the Shaw case to Salvador Panzeca, a Shaw attorney, last August.

Bethell appeared at the court clerk's office yesterday afternoon and was released on his own recognizance bond. He would not comment on the charge.

The charge carries a penalty of six months in jail or \$100 fine.
