Egan told me he was willing to testify to this in court in N.O. Apparently, the anti-Hoffa crew (Epstein) of the DJ is trying to charge him with carrying a \$25,000 contributions from the Teamsters to Garrison.

He was supposed to have been here by now but is snowed in. He was going to come here before going to N.O. or Indiana, if my recollection is correct, or both.

When I spoke to Bud today, he said Egan had told him the same thing.
