Withheld records - ticklers not provided

While it is not possible that FME FOLA agents were not aware of the existence and the need for the existence of ticklers in this massive investigation not one has been produced voluntarily and the one that was, ultimately, produced was gutted after my request for it.

I thus can call to your attention on appeal those ticklers to existence of which are proven in specific records, other than by general citations of records relating to FEI marks and practices.

There is a sarginal note on 105-82555- 4295 roading ? 1 cc. retained as tickler RDR." These are the initials of Michard D. Rogge, supervisor in the Criminal Section of the General Investigative Division, also referred to as "case agent." He is one of those rushed to Dallas immediately from FRIM, with Inspector Malley.

The subject matter is the missed shot, phlyed down by the FM, which ignored it for about a half year, only then sow play dirty tricks with it. This embject matter may well have been within discovery in C.A. 75-226, but had the tickler been disclosed then it sight have burt the Department's defense of that case and would have hidden the existence of these many ticklers.

Hornen destruction proceedures did not apply to this case, a permanently open case, according to Director "cover's Commission testimony. Ragge's ticklers should still exist, have not been provided, and along with all the others I renew my request for it and for them.

UNDERWOOD stated that he returned to this area on November 23, 1963, and took 16 millimeter movie film of the mark and then took movie film, standing on the spot looking toward the sixth floor window located in the southeast corner of the Texas School Book Depository Building, for a reference point. UNDERWOOD stated that at that time he did not know if the mark on the curb would be pertinent so he filed the film for possible future use. UNDERWOOD stated that the object which struck the curb did not break the concrete nor leave a permanent mark. He advised that the exact location could possibly be located through using the reference photograph with a wide angle lens.
