Skelton, Royce G., same identification, "thought he heard four shots, but could not tell their exact source"

Reilly, Frank E., electrician at Union Terminal, "heard three shots which seemed to come from the trees 'On the north side of Elm Street at the corner up there'."

Holland, S. M., - "There were four shots which sounded as though they came from the trees on the north side of Elm Street where he saw a puff of smoke"

Murphy, Thomas J., mail foreman at Union Terminal - "heard two shots and said that they came from a spot just west of the Depository"

Bowers - in RR tower, "heard three shots, which sounded as though they came either from the Depository Building or near the mouth of the Triple Underpass."

- R.116: Hudson, Emmett J., groundskeeper of Delaey Plaza - "heard a third shot after the shot which hit the President in the head."

Mrs. Kennedy - testimony indicated that "neither the first nor the second shot missed. ~~Immediately~~ Immediately after the first noise she turned, because of the Governor's yell, and saw her husband raise his hand to his forehead. Then the second shot struck the President's head."

Skelton, Royce G., watchman from railroad bridge - "after two shots, 'the car came on down close to the Triple Underpass' and an additional shot 'hit in the left front of the President's car on the cement.' .. thought that there had been a total of four shots, either the third or fourth of which hit in the vicinity of the underpass."
