Shriver Blasts Ford, Nixon

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Sept. 29 (AP)—R Sargent Shriver, the 1972 Democratic vice presidential nominee and former Peace Corps director, let loose a blistering attack last night on the "reactionary type policies" of the Ford administration and the "corruption" of the Nixon years.

Shriver called for basing the Democratic party's 1976 presidential campaign strategy on recapturing the formerly "solid South" in the congressional races this November.

And. Shriver said, any solution to the world's inflation and energy problems arrived at unilaterally by the United States will be a "phony solution."

Shriver spoke before the 1974 Virginia State Democratic Campaign Kickoff dinner, sponsored by the state's Young Democrats Federation, at the University of Virginia.
