

Eunice Scores Call For JFK, RFK Probes

SAN ANTONIO, Tex. (UPI) —Eunice Kennedy Shriver says the Kennedy family is satisfied with the results of the investigations into the assassinations of John F. and Robert F. Kennedy and see no reason for any further inquiries.

Mrs. Shriver, wife of 1972 vice presidential candidate Sargent Shriver, commented yesterday on a resolution introduced in Congress calling for new investigations into the murders of her two brothers.

The resolution, introduced by Rep. Henry B. Gonzalez, D-Tex., calls for a new investigation to determine whether the deaths of the Kennedys, the murder of Martin Luther King and the wounding of Alabama Gov. George Wallace might in some way be linked.

Gonzalez said revelations in the Watergate inquiry warranted such a new investigation.

"First of all, I didn't know that," she said when asked about the San Antonio congressman's resolution. "That's been done before and nothing came of it."

The Warren Commission decided that Lee Harvey Oswald, acting alone, assassinated President Kennedy in Dallas.
