Defense Rests Case In **RFK Murder Tria**

The LOS ANGELES (AP) defense rested its case Thursday in the murder trial of Sirhan Bishara Sirhan-a case a psychiatrist called absurd in nature but nonetheless valid.

"The defendant rests," attorney Grant B. Cooper announced at 3:46 p.m. after a month of defense testimony concerning the assassination of Sen, Robert F. Kennedy.

The jury of eight men and four women then was dismissed for the night. The state on Friday will begin rebuttal testimony, adding to a record already over 7,000 pages since the trial began Jan. 7.

It had been the state's intention to open rebuttal with a film of Kennedy's victory speech in the California Democratic primary, delivered only moments before and a few feet away from his assassination in Los Angeles' Ambassador Hotel,

Judge Herbert V. Walker de-

nied the request to show the 12minute film, saying it would be inflamatory since Sirhan in his testimony gave no indication that he heard Kennedy speak, The state said it wanted to show the film to remove any doubt in the minds of jurors that its content could have triggered Sirhan

to shoot Kennedy. The claim that Sirhan killed Kennedy while in a self-induced trance earlier was described by a defense psychiatrist as "too illogical even for the theater of the absurd"- but he called it valid nonetheless.

"To me this is a script which would never be acceptable in class B motion pictures," said Dr. Bernard Diamond, a University of California criminologist, "and yet these are, I think, the reality of the psychiatric findings."

Diamond was the final major witness in a month of defense See SIRHAN, Page 5

In a summary, Diamond wrote: "I agree that this is an Diamond 35absurd and preposterous story, unlikely and incredible. I doubt that Sirhan himself agrees with me as to how everything happened."

Among windup defense witnesses was Dr. Georgene Se-ward, a slender, graying woman he psychologist from Los Angeles. ge It was from her that Sirhan for the first time in weeks of Ŧ ntestimony heard himself called de crazy- a term hitherto shrouded nin such professional words as psychotic, paranoiac or schizo-8 phrenic. ve Dr. Seward was asked by the prosecution to evaluate tests th made on Sirhan by other psyhe chologists. She agreed with de them that Sirhan represented "a clear case of schizophrenic or he reaction of a paranoiac type-a psychosis." She asked to assume that cer-
