## Prosecution Data Given to Sirhan Counsel

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Lawyers for Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, charged with murdering Sen. Robert F. Kennedy, have won the right to examine a list of prosecution witnesses and prosecution evidence, including notebooks said to be Sirhan's diaries.

Mayor Sam Yorty has said the notebooks contain a statement that Kennedy must be killed by June 5. The senator was fatally shot last June 5 at the Ambassador Hotel.

SIRHAN'S lawyers have said the notebooks were seized illegally, but Superior Court Judge Herbert V. Walker ruled they are admissible. He turned them over to the defense for

study yesterday.

Defense attorneys toted them out of the court in a big cardboard box, also containing statements by Sirhan's high school classmates and the names of prospective prosecution witnesses.

One item requested by the defense apparently bothered Sirhan. "No, no," he said as Walker handed over statements by members of the Rosicrucian Lodge.

THE ROSICRUCIAN order is a mystical group based in San Jose, Calif. Sirhan, a 24-year-old Jordanian, reportedly joined it and wrote to it from jail.

Sirhan agreed that his lawyers and prosecuting attorneys could meet in private to talk about his case without him.

One of his lawyers told newsmen a psychiatrist from the University of California school of criminology visited Sirhan in his cell earlier in the day.

"We're going to have every test made we know of," said another.

Sirhan looked pale but confident. He swiveled in his courtroom chair and flashed smiles at newsmen. The judge said he could be immunized against the Hong Kong flu.

Sirhan goes on trial Jan. 9.
