WASHINGTON--LAWYERS FOR SIRHAN B. SIRHAN TOLD THE SUPREME COURT TODAY "SIGNIFICANT PHYSICAL EVIDENCE" NOW SHOWS THAT THE ARAB IMMIGRANT DID NOT FIRE THE BULLET WHICH KILLED SEN. ROBERT F. KENNEDY IN JUNE OF 1964.

AN APPEAL ON BEHALF OF SIRHAN SIRHAN WAS FILED ASKING REVIEW OF A CALIFORNIA SUPREME COURT JUDGMENT ON JULY 26 OF THIS YEAR AFFIRMING THE MURDER CONVICTION.

THE APPEAL CONCERNED THAT SIRHAN "WAS CAPTURED AT THE SCENE WIELDING A STILL SMOKING GUN" AT THE HOTEL AMBASSADOR IN LOS ANGELES.

BUT IT SAID PSYCHIATRISTS "DUMMED INTO HIS MIND THAT HE WAS GUILTY" ALTHOUGH SOME EVIDENCE INDICATED A MENTAL BLOCK PRECLUDING RECOLLECTION OF COMMITTING THE CRIME.

THE LAWYERS ARE BRINGING UP "A TEAM OF PSYCHIATRISTS, CRIMINALISTS, BALLISTIC PHYSICIANS, AND ENGINEERING PHYSICISTS, WHICH HAVE UNCOVERED SIGNIFICANT PHYSICAL EVIDENCE WHICH POINTS TO SIRHAN'S RELOADING OF THE FATAL BULLET."

THE LAWYERS SAID STANLEY S. HANSON AND GEORGE R. MILMAN OF BEVERLY HILLS, SAID THEY RECEIVED EVIDENCE THAT THEIR COMMENTS ARE OUTSIDE THE RECORD IN THE CASE BUT ARE OFFERED "IN PARTIAL EXPLANATION OF AN OTHERWISE UNCHALLENGED CONTENTION (SIRHAN) WAS THE SOLE ASSASSIN OF THE SENATOR."
