

### Sirhan Trial

LOS ANGELES — A number of employees in the county clerk's office were given lie detector tests in connection with the report of mishandling of evidence in the Robert F. Kennedy assassination.

After the weekend disclosure that evidence in the trial of Sirhan Sirhan may have been mishandled, county clerk William Sharp was ordered to inspect the office for possible security breaches, to reevaluate its control system and to inventory exhibits and transcripts from the trial.

Sharp said his investigation "failed to disclose any mishandling" of the exhibits. He conceded that the exhibits had been viewed, but said he has no evidence that anyone but attorneys connected with the case, or their agents, have handled the key exhibits. He said this was permissible under ground rules established by Judge Herbert V. Walker.
