'Polka dot girl' takes own life

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — A go-go dancer questioned briefly by police last year in the assassination of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy has died of a self-administered overdose of Secoanal.

She was Kathy Fullmer, 23,

who contacted police after learning they were looking for a "girl in a polka dot dress" in the Kennedy case.

Miss Fullmer, who danced under the name of Sindy Ross, was not identified until Friday. She was found unconscious in a motel in suburban El Sereno Monday and died at County-USC Medical Center Tuesday.

POLKA DOT dresses briefly became an issue in the Kennedy investigation after one of the senator's campaign workers, Sando Serrano, told officers she had seen a woman in polka dot attire run from the Ambassador Hotel after the assassination.

The woman was supposed to have shouted: "We shot him."

Investigation disclosed that scores of women in polka dot dresses had attended the rally where Kennedy was shot by Sultan B. Sirhan, now on trial in Los Angeles.

Police later discounted Miss Serrano's story.

MISS FULLMER was found by motel employees at 5:30 p.m. Monday. She had been asked to be called at that hour to get ready for work.

Scrawled on the mirror of her room were the words:

"Lord you gave me a mountain

I am love to climb—Cuddy
A wooden box will do."
