B. Sirhan was allegedly similar to language used in a book published by the company.

The findings of the psychiatrist, Dr. Martin M. Schorr of San Diego, have been used at the trial of Sirhan, assassin of Senator Robert F. Kennedy. Dr. Schoor reportedly used language similar to that in Dr. James A. Brussel's "A Caseboow of a Crime Psychiatrist," published by Bernard Geis Associates.

In announcing that his company would not sue, Mr. Geis said, "I feel that prosecution would be persecution."
