Agein your letter of the 16th and the enclosed copy of the order likeve questions to which I seek the answers.

If I read the scenty additions to the form correctly, but one motion was presented to the court, that being "leave to file in forms pauperis". Not you returned all my papers, even the covering letters.

I do not know the legal definition in Illinois, but I would assume that a man without income and with debts greatly exceeding assets would quality, else how can be have any of the protection and rights of the law.

Whether or not this is the case, there is the elternative you have denied me, that of arranging, somehow, to post the bond. Until there was a decision on the motion in forms peuperis, attempting to arrange the requisite bend was premature.

Therefore, it seems to me returning the papers is also premature. An in error in this opinion?

Also, are there other forms in which bend can be made? For example, were a citizen of Illinois to make the proper offers, would this be acceptable?

I want to be able to proceed with this matter. I would appreciate it if all the questions could be missed and answered at a single time, for delay in itself is a denial of legal rights. I appreciate the fact that perhaps denost all of your dealings are with lawyers who do not have to be informed of these things, but for the courts to have meaning to sitisons, citzens without law admention should be emabled to comply with requirements promptly and should be informed completely. Gen you please take the timeto inform me of my remaining alternatives and the basis upon which the metion was denied or the specific reasons in: judge ruled that I do not quelify in forms paperis?
