Suit Claims 5 Conspired To Kill JFK

CHICAGO (AP) — A ^{page 1} suit filed in U.S. District Court contends the National Archives in Washington is withholding information that shows President John F. Kennedy died as the result of a conspiracy and not at the hands of a lone assassin.

The suit, filed yesterday by legal researcher Sherman Skolnick, demands that the Warren Report be declared void.

The suit asserts that five conspirators planned to kill Kennedy at the Army-Air Force football game in Chicago on Nov. 2, 1963.

But the assassination attempt was rescheduled for Dallas, the suit said, when the President canceled his Chicago trip because of a cold.

The Warren Commission, appointed by then President Lyndon B. Johnson to investigate the assassination, said Kennedy was killed by a single man, Lee Harvey Oswald, and it could find no evidence of any conspiracy.
