Archives sued over JFK 'plot'

CHICAGO — A suit charging the National Archives in Washington with suppressing documents concerning an alleged plot to assassinate the late President John F. Kennedy in Chicago was filed yesterday in U.S. District Court.

The suit, filed by legal researcher Sherman Skolnick, contends the archives are withholding information that shows Kennedy died not at the hands of a lone assassin but as the result of a conspiracy.

It asserts that five conspirators planned to kill Kennedy at the Army-Air Force football game in Chicago Nov. 2, 1963. But when the President canceled his appearance because of a cold, the assassination was rescheduled for Dallas three weeks later.

The Warren Commission said Kennedy was killed by a single man, Lee Harvey Oswald, and that it could find no evidence of any conspiracy.
