The manuscript about which I wrote you and Hirsh Goldberg June 7, when it was completed, has been retyped. I did not make as many copies as I'd have liked because of the cost, which is a real factor when my medicines cost from \$750 a month up. But although I did not expect to hear from Goldberg and do not think he considers that he is in a position to do anything, I did have copies made for you and for him. With what will not be with the computer disks for those I work with, the exhibits I use.

I did not mail you the copy for you because you said you'd be coming soon.

If you think you will not I'll mail it. Otherwise I'll keep it until you are here.

I've sent <sup>a</sup> copy, with the exhibits, to Dean Gifford at the law school.

The text is a few pages more than 250 and the exhibits are about 100 pages.

I suspected from the first that Hall sought all the attention he got as part of an effort to go higher at Ohio State. A letter from a teacher friend in Columbus tells me that the OSU president resigned and there are those who believe Hall is after that job.

If the dean at the law school reads what I sent him or has a staff member read it for him there should be some embarrassment for them.

If it is read it should also open minds a bit.

On a different subject it could be a real scandal but on this the Sun in particular will have no interest.

Perhaps if they get it, it may add to the education of the student lawyers on the review staff.
