He was stationed on Houston Street facing west on the corner near Elm. After the shots, he thought the shots came from a point described by Liebeler as "from this little concrete structure up behind No. 7?" (reference to a place marked on Exhibit 354, Vol. XVI, p.949. It is the northwestern most of the concrete decorations of Desley Plaza.)

So he ran down there and then went to the north of the spot marked on the exhibit. He couldn't get there the way he tried, so he had to go around an obstruction. He stayed there for about an bour and neither he nor the "bunch of county officers back there plus the policemen" found anything.

He is certain there were 3 shots. (p.568)

On p.569, in different words he seems to describe the "reverberation" mentioned by others. Asked if what he "heard that day" was "consistent with the proposition that the shots came from the School Book Depository Building?" he wouldn't say and he said he couldn't say - "I just don't know. Where I was standing it just sounded like it was all around there."
