Invades Chicago

CHICAGO, Jan. 18.—Gerald L. K. Smith, Detroit rabble-rouser and national director of the America First Party, has invaded Chicago to serve notice on the Republican Party that there must be no "monkeying around in foreign matters."

"The Republican Party can take an America First policy or we will start a new party," Smith told a sympathetic audience of 500, which cheered lustily when he praised Col. Robert R. McCormick, publisher of the *Chicago Tribune*, and hissed every mention of "internationalism" and "Roosevelt."

Smith said he was happy to be labeled "a four-year locust" by Gov. William H. Wills, of Vermont. "It shows," Smith roared, "that Gerald L. K. Smith has become one with whom to reckon . . . America Firsters are no longer in the doghouse."
