Dear Dike:

Enclosed, a wire copy of the story I did as a result of my visit to New Orleans.

I've never seen a story with such a sticky aftermath -- the nuts keep after me by telephone. In the space of a couple of hours yesterday:

-- [redacted] called my New Orleans bureau to say he had highly confidential information for me at no fee; that he would be dead in a week; that he was leaving his wife; he didn't like my story (although he had not read it) and so on for 90 minutes.

-- [redacted] called to ask for a copy of the story. The office told him to go buy a paper.

-- [redacted] called ostensibly to complain about my story, but to offer, too, to turn over to us evidence of a Washington plot to discredit Garrison.

[redacted] that fellow should change brands.
