Kleindienst, in Paris, Notes Help on Heroin

PARIS, Nov. 20 (AP)—Attorney General Richard G. Kleindienst thanked two French Cabinet ministers today for their anti-narcotics drive and told them that it had resulted in a heroin shortage on the East Coast of the United States.

Mr. Kleindienst and John E. Ingersoll, director of the Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs, met with Justice Minister René Pleven and Interior Minister Raymond Marcellin.

An announcement said that the talks were informal, and there was speculation that they dealt with the diplomatic imbroglio resulting from the extradition of three Frenchmen from Brazil to the United States last week.

The three were indicted in New York for drug smuggling. Two of them are wanted for murder in France, and French authorities had asked Brazil to extradite them to Paris.
