Dear Richard Sobol,

In the course of other research, I have learned several things that I believe bear on our discussion, the

suits I want to file, and my letter of five day ago.

The Commission directed that it receive all the "raw materials" on which the various reports and studies made for it by the executive agencies were based. It directed, by formal resolution, that all of its unpublished materials be transferred to the Archives for the use and benefit of the people subject to law and regulation. And despite what has been written elsewhere, despite any official or semi-official denials, it did have the pictures of the President's autopsy.

Not the X-rays, so far as I know, but the pictures. This could have been misrepresented and lied about because it is contained in an executive-session transcript that the members thought would be as they classified it, "top secret". I have it. They did not even expect the staff to see this. The statement is by the general counsel, J. Lee Rankin, in response to repeated direct questions by members.

In the Bringuier matter, although it is my understanding that he was ordered by the court to effect proper service within 30 days, he has made no effort to serve me.

I also wish it were possible for you to be here and see the text and documentation for my new book, *SOUP D'ETAT*. I think much of it bears on areas of your interest. I have shocking documentation about the National States Rights Party, what it planned, claimed credit for and aspired to. I now have no doubt at all that a large part of troubles in the South for which the Klan is credited is accomplished by the NSRP, sometimes using the more extreme members of the Klan.
