

Warren Unit Counsel Hits Connally View

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Dist. Atty. Arlen Specter, a counsel for the Warren Commission, says Texas Gov. John B. Connally is "just incorrect" in disputing the "single-bullet" decision in the case.

Specter was instrumental in developing the decision.

Specter, at a news conference yesterday, said that based on home movies the commission found compelling evidence that a single bullet struck President Kennedy in the neck and then struck Connally. **DOLTON**

Specter said, however, he did not eliminate the possibility three bullets hit the men, but said, "in any event, the single-shot assumption is well founded."

Regarding proposals that the

investigation be reopened, Specter said, "I would not express any disagreement with anyone who wanted to review the commission's work or reopen the investigation, but personally I don't think this would serve any useful purpose."

"There has been no new evidence and no sound inferences to change in any way the conclusions of logical deductions of the commission."
