PHILADELPHIA, March 3 (AP)-District Attorney Arlen Specter, who was an associate counsel for the Warren Commission, which investigated the assassination of President Kennedy, today was slated by the Republican organization as its choice for Mayor in the May primary.

The 35-year-old Specter, a former Democrat who switched to the Republican Party in 1965, and won the District Attorney's office, is credited with writing a considerable portion of the Warren Commission's final report.

Specter was chosen by the Party's 54-man selection committee headed by William. Devlin, chairman of the Republican City Committee. Devlin said the selection was made without first obtaining the Dis-
