lead rectal As previously reported to the Commission, certain small analyzed spectrociephically to determine whether they could be associated with one or more of the later bullet fragments and no significant differences were found within the ecusitivity of the spectrographic method. Because of the higher sensitivity of neutron activation analysis certain of the small lead fragments were subjected to neutron activation analyses and comparisons with the larger bullet fragments. linile minor variations in composition were found by this method, these were not considered sufficient to perinit positively differentiating arcing tic larger bullet fragments and thus positively determining from which of the larger bullet fragments any given small lead fragment may have come.

Gencially speaking, the small lead metal particles foll foo two catczorics. In one category fell the small lead fragment $i$ from the ain of Governor Connolly and the lead from the almost intact pullet recovered from the stretcher. In the other category $[$ fell the lead particles frow the head of president kennedy, the lead fragments from the rear floor of the car and the lead from the mutilated bullet fragment from the front seat cushion. While there is a probability that the fragment from the Governor's arm came from the whole bullet rather then from the mutilated bullet and that the fragments from the president's head and from the floor of the car could lave como from the mutilated bullet fragment from
I the front scat cushion, it remains a probability and does not perinit
