LEE HARVEY OSWALD was not one of the men involved in the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, according to a computer expert who studied 300 photographs and 25,000 frames of movie film. RICHARD F. SPRAGUE, president of Personal Data Service Co., says Kennedy was killed by a conspiracy involving more than 50 persons, including some Dallas policemen and members of the CIA. He said that though the Dallas assassination was "the most photographed murder in the world," the Warren Commission, which officially named Oswald as the killer, studied only 26 of 500 still photographs available. Sprague used computer analysis in his study.
