Dear Mr. Berkley,

How many roads must be paved to hell before too many good people learn we need no more?

Your May article by Dick Sprague was terrible, irresponsible, and has done much damage it will take long to overcome. Your "Report No. 2" is very hurtful in other ways, but you lack the knowledge to understand it. If I do not think you intend these things, I am also completely without doubt about them. Nor do I think that Dick is other than a fine guy, with the best of intentions. In fact, in the areas where he has done well, I have just directed technical assistance to him.

How many responsible media editors can read the allegation that there are "about six confessions" to involvement in the assassination without being turned off all over again? About. Does Dick have them and lack the arithmetical capacity to count them? Every responsible editor seeing this makes a note to block further publication of anything about the assassination. There is no problem getting irresponsible, inaccurate writing published. The media have an unerring sense of how to destroy our credibility, and such monstrous pieces as this accomplish it well.

In your second you use material you have no right to use, without having the faintest idea how much work lies behind it and that your sensationalism ended, and such things are hurtful beyond measure. It is a simple matter to raid the files of others. You have something that pretty clearly comes from Dul, who told me today he agrees but doesn't remember giving it to anyone, for he knew he shouldn't. Thus you can pick up a few scraps, play big men, and kill any chance of succeeding with ongoing assassination inquiry. What is accomplished by this, other than the gratification of a few ego's?

The history of the filter documents is entirely other than you represent them. I'd appreciate an full explanation of what lies behind your generality. They were not just "notices" by one of the researchers in the Archives", were not unknown, are by no means the entire story, and are part of a completed book which does deal with them in an effective way, in a proper context, giving them the meaning lost upon you, and how the edge is taken from that.

Neither you nor Dick has the knowledge required for what you so lustily attempt. Because you are not bad people, at some point you are going to wind up either without conscience or killing yourselves. I have yet to hear a single word of other than condemnation from a single person working in the field, whether or not a real "expert".
