What you asked me to keep in confidence is a good idea. I hope that you see your way clear to make the effort and that it then gets the attention it warrants.

There is something you should known pabout Gwinn: he remains friendly with the FoI and plways was. Even when I gave him what it said about him behind his back. The FoI not only didn't trust him to the do the JFK Maks, it froze him out and said nasty things about him. Gallagher, in particular.

Long after that he did the NAA work for HSCA. I was able to anticipate some is of this accurately and primed a reporter to ask him outside the hearing room, after he testified. He then admitted that he not only could not validate the specimens he testednot one of them met its official description.

But he omitted this in his testimony, when personal and professional honor and integrity demanded that he make it clear. Without going into details, he had reason to spapect that all those small specimens came from a single source, not from different bullets. (I think they were all cut from the base of 399 in the FBI Lab and I can make out more of a case for this than I did in Post Mortem, having deposed FBI Lat agents, including Gallagher and Frazier.)

You may have little or no choice now and I don't know who to suggest as a substitute if you can make a substitution. Moreover, I don't know that any other expert you might get does not have the same complications in his life.

I write to inform you and so you can keep your eyes - and mind - wide open.
