HD: SPECTER STAYS SINGLE-MINDED

LD: The controversial movie "'JFK'" attempts to shoot holes in the single-bullet assassination theory. Which isn't necessarily a bad thing, unless, of course, you're the guy who came up with the theory and you're running for re-election. That's Arlen Specter's current problem. In a freak accident of bad timing for the Republican senator from Pennsylvania, who was an investigator for the Warren Commission in 1964, the movie portrays as utterly preposterous his theory that one zigzagging bullet halted in midair and even at one point made a "'dramatic U-turn'" and not only hit President Kennedy but wounded Texas Gov. John Connally. But Specter stands by the theory and dismisses criticism of it as uninformed. He mentioned in an interview last week of someday "'owning'" Time-Warner. Warner Bros. distributed the movie. Asked if he intended to sue for libel, Specter said: "'No comment.'"
