Oliver Stone's Top-Secret Screening

Dallas County commissioners were debating yesterday whether to sign affidavits of secrecy before a scheduled preview of Oliver Stone's upcoming film, "JFK." The agreement between Stone and the commissioners that allowed Stone to film at the former Texas School Book Depository, (from which Lee Harvey Oswald allegedly fired the bullet that killed President Kennedy) called for a preview but apparently not the affidavit. The terms that allowed Stone to film in restricted areas also give the commissioners the right to add a disclaimer to the film's credits if they were unhappy with the movie's slant. The film, which stars Kevin Costner, adds fuel to the fires of conspiracy theorists, questioning whether Oswald acted alone. Stone has kept details of the movie close to his vest. The movie is scheduled for release Dec. 20.
