KGB agent claims Oswald info

MOSCOW (AP) — A retired KGB agent claimed Thursday to have new information about the assassination of President John F. Kennedy and urged the creation of a joint Russian-U.S. investigatory commission.

"What happened in the United States of America in 1963 is not only an (unsolved) element of American history, but ... a gap in world history," said Oleg M. Nechiporenko, a senior agent who was thrown out of Mexico in 1971 for purportedly scheming to topple its government.

Mr. Nechiporenko refused to give details and suggested he expected to be paid for his information, which he called a "commercial secret (that) will be disclosed in a certain way."
