

'T2,' 'Lambs,' 'JFK' all a cut above in Eddie noms

The expert editing jobs on "JFK," "The Silence of the Lambs" and "Terminator 2: Judgment Day" have been recognized by the American Cinema Editors, who nominated the three in the feature film category of the 42nd annual ACE Eddie Awards.

"All of our nominees have produced outstanding work," said ACE president George Grenville in announcing the contenders. Included among the projects vying for a trophy is "Hearts of Darkness: A Filmmaker's Apocalypse,"

a behind-the-scenes look at the making of "Apocalypse Now," whose director, Francis Ford Coppola, is the recipient of this year's ACE Golden Eddie.

Presenting Coppola with his award at the March 21 gala will be Billy Wilder. Jack Lemmon and John Frankenheimer will also be presenting at the Beverly Hilton event.

On another front, Grenville said 1992 marked the last year that the National Academy of Cable Programming could use the moniker

ACE in conjunction with its own Awards for Cable Excellence. Grenville said the cable group is in the process of trying to negotiate a settlement after losing two court cases.
