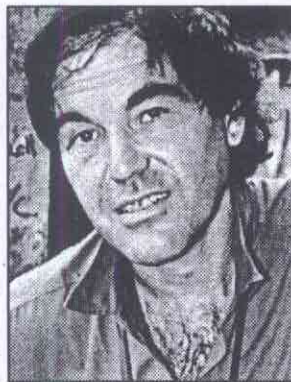

JFK BY THE NUMBERS: A&E found Lee Harvey Oswald guilty of assassinating John F. Kennedy last week, and got a viewership boost. A&E averaged a 1.4 rating, up from its usual 1.2 (a rating point equal 520,000 homes) for the five-part *Trial of Lee Harvey Oswald*. Friday's installment of Bill Kurtis' *Who Killed JFK? On the Trail of the Conspiracies* pulled in a 1.9 rating. Kurtis interviewed Warren Commission member Gerald Ford, but not all of their conversation made it on air. "He said, 'I've been talking to some friends about turning my presidential library in Ann Arbor (Mich.) into an assassination studies center,'" Kurtis says. By the way, Oliver Stone is still pitching his *JFK*. On March 22, Showtime airs a new documentary, *Oliver Stone: Inside Out*. And it was Showtime that originally aired *The Trial of Lee Harvey Oswald* in 1986.
