Canada

C/FP acquires 'Dogs'

Toronto-based C/FP Distribution Inc. has acquired Canadian rights to Cannes festival hit "Strictly Ballroom," by director Baz Luhrmann and Quentin Tarantino's "Reservoir Dogs," starring Harvey Keitel, Tim Roth, Steve Buscemi, Chris Penn and Lawrence Tierney, company's senior vp Jeff Sackman announced late last month. Both films will be released in Canada in the fall.

Presenters to art fests

The Canadian government and California Presenters Inc., a presenting consortium with over 150 member organizations and individual artists, will collaborate in a three-year pilot project, which will send presenters to various Canadian arts festivals. The Canadian government has committed CAN\$12,000 to encourage California booking agents to schedule Canadian artists for tours in California.

France

Audiences dropping

The death of private TV network La Cinq has caused an overall loss of audience share for France's four other terrestrial channels. According to media monitoring group Mediаметrie, the audience for prime-time has dropped by 10% since the demise of La Cinq last April, representing a loss of 2.1 million viewers in the 8 p.m.-8:30 p.m. time slot. The study noted that viewing habits remain stable in the morning and afternoon.

Hachette's sale

Media group Hachette SA on Monday said it agreed to sell valuable company real estate. The company said it had an agreement to sell its properties in the Saint Germain section of Paris to real estate agent ImmoPar SA for 500 million francs (\$98.4 million). A Hachette spokesman said the company couldn't say yet what the impact of the sale would be on earnings this year.

China

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In Hong Kong, the commission sought opinion on whether Radio Free Asia should broadcast to the colony after its reunification with China in 1997.

Headquarters for the new service have not been proposed as yet — although Thailand and the Philippines are thought to be candidates — and no costs have been suggested, although Radio Free Europe, Radio Liberty and the Voice of America each have annual budgets of more than \$220 million.
