'Hook' on top, but losing its edge

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — "Hook" was tops at the weekend box office again but appeared to be losing steam, industry sources said Sunday.

"Hook" earned an estimated \$9 million over the weekend and has made about \$26 million since premiering a week and a half ago. TriStar Pictures said last week it expected the film to gross more than its \$100 million production and distribution cost by early January.

Second was "Father of the Bride," which earned an estimated \$6.6 million in its first weekend of wide

release.

"JFK," Oliver Stone's controversial look at the assassination of President Kennedy, was next with \$5 million in its first weekend of wide release.

The animated Disney film "Beauty and the Beast," followed with an estimated \$4.9 million. Next were "The Last Boy Scout," and "Star Trek VI: The Undiscovered Country" with \$4.8 million each.

"Bugsy," earned an estimated \$4.5 million in its first weekend.
