

Be lonesome no more

You should be able to rent "Lonesome Dove" at the video store very soon. Screenwriter-producer Bill Witten says now that the TV contract is up, there's nothing to keep the epic, based on Larry McMurtry's novel, out of your VCR. There's still talk of a sequel or "prequel", but don't look for Bill to be involved. "I wouldn't try it again," he said. "I don't think you could assemble that cast again. And so much of that was serendipity." Bill says he currently is working on a television series for CBS. He said "Ned Blessing," based on a character from a number of his tales, is tentatively scheduled to debut in January 1992. Bill said he doesn't have the script ready yet, but vowed the show "will be made in Texas with Texans.'

Pass the roles

If you look like Lee Harvey Oswald, this may be your one chance to have something good come of it. Casting director Kris Nicolau says she's looking for people who look the way Oswald, John Kennedy, Jackie Kennedy and John and Neille Comally looked in 1963. Kevin Coetner, mentioned by sources in connection with the project, apparently is being considered for a role other than the aforementioned ones. The film is scheduled to start shooting on April 15 [after Ollie files his taxes]. 


