"There's a much larger story here than the Kennedy family's personal grief about John, or New Orlean's personal grief about being embarrassed about Clay Shew, or Dallas' personal grief about being the ambush site, or about having asstrange police force that acted in a strange manner. It's beyond those three personal issues: It's a universal problem that stretches into the '90s, and goes to the foundations of our society."
