

Stoner Wins Extradition Delay

MARIETTA, Ga. — J.B. Stoner, an avowed white racist indicted in the bombing of an Alabama church in 1958, has won a 30-day delay of extradition to seek an FBI file that he said can prove Alabama Attorney General William Baxley knows he is innocent.

"I'll be vindicated and that crazy, race-mixing lunatic Bill Baxley will go down to defeat in his race for governor of Alabama," Stoner said as he left Cobb County Superior Court.

Judge Howell Ravan, skeptical of the prosecution's extradition papers and Alabama's claim that it can be proved Stoner was in Birmingham June 29, 1958, yesterday gave Stoner 30 days to obtain his FBI file under the federal Freedom of Information Act.
