

Man Charged in Bombing Seeks More F.B.I. Data

ATLANTA, Dec. 30 (UP) — In an attempt to get information that he says will show that he was not in Birmingham when a black church was bombed 20 years ago, J. B. Stoner today filed suit seeking the Federal Bureau of Investigation's complete files on him.

Mr. Stoner, a white supremacist who was indicted by a Birmingham grand jury on charges of bombing an unoccupied church in 1958, is fighting extradition to Alabama. Georgia Gov. George Bushbee has signed a warrant authorizing the Marietta, Ga., lawyer's return to Alabama.

On Dec. 20, Cobb County Judge Hoell Ravan granted a 30-day continuance in Mr. Stoner's habeas corpus hearing so that the avowed racist could obtain his F.B.I. records.

The suit, filed in Federal District Court in Atlanta, contends that the F.B.I. provided incomplete documents.

"I've gotten 14,084 pages, but so many pages were blanked out that they have no value," Mr. Stoner explained.

The suit also requests \$11,000 in damages and attorney's fees.
