

Removed From Subversive List

Twenty-five groups on the Attorney General's subversive list don't exist any more, the Subversive Activities Control Board said yesterday. And one of them hasn't been around for 32 years.

The board announcement was the latest in a weeding-out process. Only the Attorney General has authority to remove an organization from the list.

Several on the list were Japanese organizations listed as defunct from December, 1941. The board said 14 of the groups were Communist in nature, nine were classified as "totalitarian and two were labeled "facist."
