SUBJECT: Appearance of Robert Survey before Leon Hubert in Dallas, May 22-23.

1. Mr. Sorrels contacted Mr. Survey prior to my arrival in Dallas on May 23, and Sorrels told me that Survey had told him that he did not have a lawyer, that he would under no circumstances appear before the Commission, that he had a very poor opinion of the Commission, and finally, that he would give a statement to the FBI provided that he was given the assurance by the FBI that his statement would not be made available to the Commission.

2. Mr. Barrfoot Sanders, U. S. Attorney, repeated his previous suggestion that he was willing to call Survey before the U. S. Grand Jury in Dallas, but pointed out that this would have to be done prior to June 3 since the Grand Jury was going to be dismissed on that date until a new Jury was impaneled in the fall.

3. I discussed this subject of Sanders with Mr. Rankin, and I told him that I was opposed to the idea, that I had spoken to Mr. Willens about it and he was opposed to the idea. Mr. Rankin concurred, and I informed Mr. Sanders by telephone on June 1, 1964 that Mr. Rankin had decided that the procedure would not be used.

4. There remains open the question of whether Survey will be called to appear as a witness by the subpoena process.
