Photographs and film clips of Oswald and two other subjects passing out Fair Play For Cuba Committee circulars in New Orleans on 8/16/63 were obtained from local television stations WMI and WDSU and furnished interested offices. Charles Hall Steele, Jr., was identified as being one of the subjects. The other subject has not been identified. Steele was interviewed 11/27/63 and he stated that Oswald had contacted him at an employment office and paid him (2.00 for passing out the circulars. He said

## DIZZIE CY TRESPESATION

Relevance is made to previous reports in this case, particularly report dated 11/25/63 by SANG L. A. Benavides, San Antonio, and my memorandum to SANG Benavides dated 11/23/63.

On 12 21/63 this office obtained from Mr. Johann Jush, Photographer, \_ (Changel 6), New Orleans, photograph of Oswald and an unidentified compenion handing but Join Play For Cuba Committee circulars in front of the International Grade Fart in Jon Oploans, Louisiana, on August 16, 1963.

In accordance with temephonic instructions from Inspector Thomas J. Welley at Bulles, Marke, the above mentioned photograph was sent to BAIC L. M. Benavides, san excense, ming of 11/25/63 by Delta and Mastern Linuines Pilots to be exhibited to Mrs. Orlansikes, San Antonio, who is referred to in SaIC Benavides' report dated

Are, Persikes said that the subject in the photograph in account weight the same young man she had seen in a television scene initially carried on 15 19 (Channel h), now Oriotas; and it was requested that photographs of the MAL film depicting Cowald and enother young man passing out circulars be obtained.

Subsequently this office obtained from TKL TV (Channel L) photographs of Occasion and suctaor young man passing out circulars, and it was exceptioned on 11/25/63 from the local PSI office that this young man is Charles Tall Itecle, Ir., son of a local deputy shoriff, who resides with his parents at 1100 matric street. Steele, having heard that his photograph had been shown on a television program, contacted the FBI office, and with his father, visited the office and was interviewed. Steele told FBI agents that he had been approached by Oswali at an employment office in New Orleans and was offered [2.00 to pass out the circulars; that he stopped passing out circulars when he discovered the content of the material; and that he saw Oswald on only the one occasion.

The above information was deraished SLIC Banavides by telephone on 11/26/63, and a copy of the photograph of Stock was furnished the San Antonio office the same date by office memorandum, to be exhibited to Frs. Tarsikes, if deemed necessary. Copies of three different photographs of Stock and Oswald, which were obtained from MIDU TV the same date were also furnished SAIC Benavices for identification purposes. Copies of the photograph obtained from WID TV were also furnished Chief's Office and the New York by copies of the memorandum dated 11/26/63.

On 11/16/63 this office obtained from Photographer Johann Rush, WUSU TV a total of settle been photographs, showing three different scenes of Oswald and another young maidentified man passing out circulars. We also obtained a short film clip from kr. Rush from which the still photographs were made. One set of each of tess three photographs, together with the film clip, were furnished Chief's Office with our memorandum dated 11/29/63, and copies were also furnished Dallas.

The "Quidebook for Marines", which Oswald had given to Carlos Tringuier, anti-Castro Cuoan, 107 Decatur Street, New Orleans, referred to in 5A A. d. Vial's report dated 12/3/63, pages 13 & 14, was also forwarded to Chief's Office with the above mentioned memorandum dated 11/29/63.

On 11/27/63 S. Gerrots and SAIC Rice interviewed Charles Hall / teele, Jr., 1458 . Adrid Street, For Crieans, and he identified his photography mentioned above. He soid that he first met Osweld on 8/16/63 when he was at the Townsiana Unemployment Civica. 12/10 and Street, New Orleans, at about 11:30 AM. He said Oswald walked which is place and asked him and at least one other man if they would be interested in whing (2.00 passing out leaflets connected with a group at place university. He will that Oswald was young and fairly neatly dressed and he thought he might be college student. He said that he made arrangements to neet Oswald at 12:00 noon the sums date in front of the international Irade Fart, corner of Camp and Common Streets, to pass out the circulars.

Stocks further advised that he arrived at the above location at 12:00 Hoon, and shortly thereafter osuald walked up with another young man, about 20 years of age, 6 feet tall, brown heir, olive complexion, wearing sport shirt, without tie. He said this unknown man was not the same person as the unidentified subject shown in above mentioned photographs passing out circulars with Oswald. He also advised that Oswald gave him a handful of leaflets which he passed out over a period of appreciately 15 minutes; that when he received a second batch of the leaflets he examined them and threw them away; that he then walked up to Oswald and told him the leaflets locked like Communistic literature, whereupon Oswald said it was not, and that the leaflets were connected with a group at Tulane University. He said he told Oswald that he did not want anything further to do with the leaflets, and that Oswald then paid him \$2.00 and he left.

Stock is undoubtedly the same young man thom Ars. Tarsikes, of San Antonio, alleged she saw in a televised scene where the assassination occurred. Steele advised, and his father verified, that he had not been away from New Orleans and was not in Dallas on the date of the assassination.

A few days prior to 12/2/63, Carlos Bringuier, anti-Castro Cogan, mantioned in paragraph 5, page 2 of this report, delivered to this office a trace recording of a debate involving Oswald, Bringuier, Ar. Balbutler, of the Information Council of The Americas, and Bill Stuckey, reporter on this tates—Item newspaper, New Orleans, which was broadcast on 0/21/63 over MDDU madio, New Orleans. bringuier advised that he was in the process of obtaining a transcript of the debate and would deliver same to this office transcript gay. On 12/2/63 Ar. Pringuier advised by telephone that Ar. Armesto Modriguez, Jr., who operates the modern language Institute, 1206 St. Charles Street, New Orleans, had a copy of the transcript. Ar. Rodriguez was contacted this same date by SA Rojer D. Counts and he agreed to furnish us with three Verifax copies of the transcript, stating that he was in the process of translating same in Spanish.

At approximately 4:00 PM(CST) on 12/2/63, Deputy Chief Paul J. Paterni advised by telephone that information had been received in Chief's Office this date indicating that Ar. Armesto Rodriguez, mentioned above, had a tape recording of the debate in question. Deputy Chief Paterni was informed that we had the tape and that Armesto Rodriguez was in the process of preparing copies of the transcript. It was requested that the tape, and copy of transcript be sent to SAIC Robert I. Bouck, Protective Research Section, as soon as possible by an airlines pilot.

The tame, together with copy of transcript, was delivered by SA Roger D. Counts on 12/2/63 to the Captain of Eastern Air Lines Flight #526, which departed New Orleans at 6:10 PM, to be picked up at Dulles Airport, Washington, D. C., by a Josefal Agent of the Protective Research Section upon arrival at 9:58 PM, SAIC Bouck having been previously advised by telephone of the method of delivery.
