MRS. ANNE TAYLOR, 617 Montgomery Avenue, Rockledge, Montgomery County, Pa., was interviewed at her home. She identified herself as the wife of THOMAS T. TAYLOR.

MRS. TAYLOR said both she and her husband attended the Quaker Haven Camp at Richmond, Ind., during 1955. At the camp delegates to the American Youth Friends Conference met for one week, commencing August 27, 1955. Representatives from the Mid-West, Southern, and Eastern parts of the United States, as well as Canada, convened at Quaker Haven Camp. During the period that the conference was held, the TAYLORs met numerous people, including RUTH HYDE. HYDE was a member of the Friends East-West Contact Committee, which was attempting to foster better relations between the United States and Russia. At the time HYDE attended the conference, she was living in Richmond, Ind.

RICHARD K. TAYLOR, cousin of THOMAS T. TAYLOR, also attended this conference. RICHARD K. TAYLOR was then serving as Clerk for the Young Friends of North America. RICHARD K. TAYLOR is believed to have befriended RUTH HYDE during the attendance at the conference. Sometime during latter 1955 HYDE moved to Philadelphia and was hired by the Young Men's Hebrew Association (YMHA) to do some type of social work with elderly groups. While in Philadelphia, HYDE resided alone in an apartment located in the center of the city. It is believed she held her position with the YMHA for approximately one year, and during this time dated RICHARD K. TAYLOR.

HYDE might have met her husband, MICHAEL R. PAINE, in Philadelphia, and thereafter moved to Texas with him. MRS. TAYLOR said neither she nor her husband knew PAINE. All contacts with HYDE ceased after she moved to Texas, approximately 1956.

MRS. TAYLOR also mentioned that RICHARD K.
TAYLOR now resides at 427 West Coulter Street, Philadelphia,
Pa., in an apartment which is located over a store. He
