

Top Service Aides See President

President Johnson held a series of meetings at the White House yesterday covering topics ranging from Vietnam to domestic agriculture.

At midday Mr. Johnson met with Gen. Maxwell Taylor, a White House consultant and former U.S. Ambassador to Saigon.

A White House spokesman said Taylor and McGeorge Bundy, special presidential adviser on national security matters, talked to Mr. Johnson about a special study of departmental matters Taylor is conducting for the President. The study deals particularly with the Departments of Defense and State.

Later, the President scheduled separate meetings with Agriculture Secretary Orville Freeman and Postmaster General Lawrence O'Brien.

The White House announced that Mr. Johnson has appointed David K. E. Bruce, U.S. Ambassador to Britain, and Douglas M. Knight, president of Duke University, as members of the Woodrow Wilson Memorial Commission.
