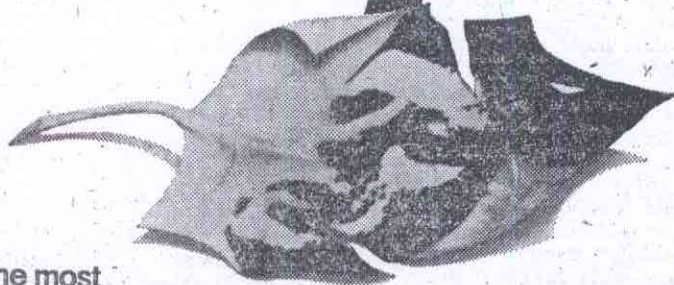


Why?
