The Dallas Attorney holds B. A. degrees from the University of Texas and Southern Methodist University, and he has been awarded LL. D degrees from Texas Christian University, Laval University, and Drake University. In addition he has received the Doctor of Hummanities degree from Japan's Rikko University and the Doctor of Civil Laws degree from Chungang University in Korea.
